REV. ASA C. POPP**

Rev. Asa Popp grew up on the Kansas prairie. Often he would tell his children stories of his early adventures with the wild creatures of that prairie. It was there he learned to love and appreciate the outdoors.

Because Asa loved the church and his denomination, early in his life, he gave his support and energies to making them the best they could be. Though his early home was in Kansas, Asa did not return there to serve upon his graduation from seminary. He served churches in South Dakota and Iowa. Soon after his "retirement" in 1964 from First Baptist Church, Red Oak, Iowa, he became the camp manager of Forest Lake Baptist Camp near Ottumwa, Iowa.

Asa was a grandfather to everyone. His love of history, stories and nature endeared him to all who came in contact with him. He loved the camp and the youth who came there.

In 1970 Asa "retired" again to serve two small rural churches. He served those churches until death in 1982. At his death his family established a campership fund in his memory. The fund was to provide summer camping opportunities for youth of Mid-American Baptist Churches.

Asa loved life and people. A phrase he often used was "It's a great life." His certainly was and we are privileged to keep his memory alive through this fund and ministry.

CAMPING SCHOLARSHIPS

A limited number of camp scholarships are available through the **Asa Popp Memorial Scholarship** program and other available scholarship funds. The amount of these funds varies each year. Every effort is made to ensure that those who want to attend camp are able to do so.

The following procedures have been established for the scholarship program:

1. Individuals and churches shall submit names of campers who **NEED** financial assistance to attend camp along with their registration forms.
2. The maximum scholarship from the Asa Popp fund shall be no more than 1/2 of the cost of camp per child. Amounts given by other available scholarship funds may vary according to need.
3. Camper scholarships shall be limited to individuals who would be unable to attend camp without assistance.
4. Requests for scholarship funds are considered in the order they are received.
5. Scholarship recipients **DO NOT** qualify for camp discounts or coupons.
